From the Desk of the Rabbi

#### MASQUERADING THROUGH LIFE

It is hard to find another festival in the Jewish calendar that can tell us more about life than the hilarious celebration of Purim.

The glorious spirit of Purim is reflected in its carnival-like nature. Other people have their annual carnivals in their calendar too. Many celebrations, like the Mardi Gras, last a full week or more. For the Jew, a week is a long period of time to party. During the week, it is a time to be reserved for creativity and not wasted in frivolity. This is why Purim is observed for only one day. The message of the holiday can be gotten across without prolonged "revelry."

On Purim we reenact the events of the Biblical Scroll of Esther. It is a Rabbinic holiday as opposed to a Biblical divinely ordained holiday. The thrilling action recorded in those ten brief chapters of Megillat Esther is read formally as part of the evening service. Then, after the Megillah and the noisemakers set the tone, we customarily adjourn to the social hall or to our homes and celebrate the victory of Mordecai and Esther over the unsuccessful plot of Haman and his henchmen. Although never prevalent among Jews according to the Talmud, one may drink on Purim until he can no longer distinguish "cursed be Haman" from "blessed be Mordecai." This custom was allowed so as to comply with the term "mishteh," which was expressly permitted in the Bible for the yearly celebration of Purim.

The festivities usually included a reenactment of the suspenseful Biblical narrative in rhyme and song, dance, costume, pantomime, and masquerade. This is the one day of the year when we get a little silly and get out of our normal zone.

Jewish History states that masquerading on Purim was first introduced at the close of the fifteenth century by Italian Jewry that had been influenced by the Roman carnivals. It appears the custom of donning masks and costumes is here to stay. Almost everyone will agree that masquerading is purely for fun and merry-making. No one is permitted to be serious or introspective on Purim. We joke, we jest, we pretend, we gloat over Haman's downfall. Yes, even I will put on my jesters crown and wear my favorite Purim shirt. Purim should never be the opportunity to masquerade as weird, questionable, and grotesque individuals. It is not a day to promote horror. Never confuse Purim with the cultural holiday of Halloween which in this country has evolved from the original pagan holiday of All Hollows Eve. We can masquerade as personifications of evil and banality such as the wicked Haman. We can masquerade as opposites of our true selves for only a short time. This is allowed on Purim.

During this joyous holiday, we must never lose sight of how many people can think Purim is never over. Consider how many clown away their days, never accomplishing much that is worthwhile. We can have a tendency to masquerade our way all along the social structure of our lives. We need to be concerned with the plight of humanity, with poverty, with war, with injustice and bigotry. We must never lose sight or forget the rising anti-Semitism that continues to plague our people as well as the racial prejudice that continues to rear its ugly head against people of all ethnic backgrounds. The message of Purim needs to be told and internalized by not just the Jewish People, but to all those who continue to be oppressed by the very nations that wish to suppress the natural rights gifted by our Creator to all humanity.

For the last few months, I have shared about a few of the people in our Congregation
 who help make our synagogue a very special place. This month, I would like to focus on
 a man who has been integral in leading CAA for years.

Dr. Wiley Roosth fulfilled many roles in our synagogue – President of the Board,
 Chairperson of the Ritual Committee, and many other roles in his long history at CAA.
 He attended services weekly until his health deteriorated. He and his wife, Rita, were
 generous contributors financially, but also with their time and mentorship. Dr. Wiley never
 wanted attention brought to himself for these acts.

More than his personal investment in Congregation Ahavath Achim, Dr. Wiley
 encouraged each person in the congregation in various ways. One of our members
 recalls Dr. Wiley telling him on numerous occasions, "We're here every Saturday!"
 Following his retirement, that member now attends every Shabbat service. If he cannot
 attend on Saturday, he comes on Friday evenings. This member has taken on an integral
 role in our shul in the past year.

When Dr. Wiley determined that he should resign as Chairperson of the Ritual Committee, he mentored his replacement for that important committee. That is one reason our services are able to run so smoothly and efficiently.

When I took on the role of President of the Board of Trustees a few years ago, I
 spent numerous visits with Dr. Wiley to gain his input and impressions of protocol. Dr.
 Wiley was a fount of knowledge about our Congregation as his father, Sam Roosth, had
 also been integrally involved in the development of the synagogue.

Baruch Dayan HaEmet. May we all remember Dr. Wiley Roosth in our own way.
For me, he will always direct the service from the last row in the sanctuary – indicating
with gestures when to open the curtain on the Aron Kodesh, telling the person carrying
the Torah to use the handrail, and letting us all know to "Load them up!" following the
Haftarah.
