From the Desk of the Rabbi Shevat-Is It Only About Trees?

When one approaches and enters into the month of Shevat, our first reaction is to think of Tu'B'shat the New Year for Trees. However, upon closer examination and research, there are a few more things about Shevat that bear attention to this month of the Jewish calendar.

- <u>It's the Eleventh Month in the Torah.</u> The Torah does not give names to the months of the year. Actually the only month in Hebrew going by a Hebrew name is Aviv or translated as spring. The remaining months of the Hebrew calendar do not have Hebrew names because...
- It's all Babylonian to Me: The Jerusalem Talmud tells us the modern names of the months "came up [to Israel] with [the returnees] from Babylon," at the onset of the second Jewish commonwealth, approximately 350 BCE. The original system was to count months in numeric order, starting from Nissan. Thus, any time a person mentioned a month, they were in effect recalling the exodus from Egypt: we are in, say, the sixth month—six months since the month of the Exodus. Thus, the numeric naming served as a constant reminder of our deliverance from Egypt. After we were delivered from Babylonian captivity, however, we started using the names we became used to using in Babylon. The month of Shevat is associated with the heavy rains of the winter season. Rain in Israel is directly tied to blessings because...
- <u>It's the Age of Aquarius!</u> Yes, the signs of the zodiac do play a role in the Hebrew calendar! The sign for the month of Shevat is Aquarius, the water bearer. Again, this ties Shevat appropriately to the rainy season and Israel this year has had a lot of rain which is beneficial for all crops especially when we would want to...
- Make Like a Tree! As I have mentioned in previous years, Shevat is well known as the month of Tu' B'Shevat, one of the 4 Jewish New Years celebrated in the course of our calendar year. It is celebrated on the 15th of Shevat. According to the Mishneh, there's an opinion that the New Year for trees should be celebrated on the 1st of the month, not the 15th. Either way, we recognize that in Israel, nature is starting to come back to life as the seemingly long dark winter days draw to a close. Speaking of long, Shevat is also known in Jewish History as...
- <u>The Long Speech of Moshe Rabbeinu!</u> The month of Shevat was when Moses prepared for his passing in the following month on the 7th of Adar. This long speech is the 5th book of the Torah or Devarim (Deuteronomy). Here Moses starts out rebuking the Children of Israel and gives the next generation words of admonition as they are about to cross the river Jordan into the land. Moses also uses this time to teach the Children of Israel...
- <u>How to Say Abraham in Chinese!</u> The Midrash teaches Moses spent the month of Shevat translating the entire Torah into the 70 major languages of the other nations that would be written on the huge plastered stones to be erected upon Israel entering the land otherwise known as "Torah on the Rocks"! However, we would be remiss if we did not bring to light the important connection between...
- <u>Torah, Women and Trees!</u> Important Biblical women are either named after trees or have a close association with trees. Esther's Hebrew name was Hadassah referring to the myrtle tree and Judah's daughter-in-law was Tamar referring to the date palm.
- The judge Deborah heard cases while sitting under Tamar Devorah, Deborah's date palm tree. The alon bachut, "the weeping tree," stands where Rebecca's nurse, another woman named Deborah, died. The verse; Etz Chaim He (The Tree of Life) is an important feminine symbol in Judaism. Women bear offspring, as the Torah bears wisdom, and trees bear fruit. A woman's children are often referred to as the "fruit of her womb." In Shevat we recognize the fabulous female connection to the life-giving cycles of nature.

Parsha Be'sha'ach in the Torah usually falls within the month of Shevat as well and is also known as Shabbat Shirah. It is here where we read the Shir Hai'Yam or Song at the Sea where Miriam and the women sang songs in celebration of Hashem's great miracle of deliverance. This is mirrored in the Haftorah where Deborah the Judge also sang in celebration of Hashem's great miracle at that time.

Firm resolve in that we will not allow our lives or heritage to be lost.

This in mind, I pray for and will work toward supporting the Faith and safety of our precious congregation throughout 2020. I hope you will join me in strengthening the safety and joyful peace of our synagogue in the coming year!

Deborah is the only female judge named in the Tanach. She was wise and fair. Deborah sat under her date palm tree and decided cases for the Israelites. Deborah, was also called a prophetess who urged the Israelites into battle, informing them that G-d had commanded it and would see to it that they would come out victorious "by the hand of a woman." When the battle was indeed won, Deborah sang a victory song. Deborah inspires us to act fairly, cultivate wisdom, and **pursue** justice. Deborah's success as a judge, an occupation that in her day was dominated by men reminds us that women can do anything.

These are just a few examples of the significances the month of Shevat brings. It is a month that honors not just the men in our Tanach, but equally if not more the strong women in Jewish history.
